





WALK GRADES: Easy — Leisurely walks with regular stops. Any climbs will be of modest gradient & length. Moderate — Cater for the more experienced walkers. Expect a full day at a steady pace. May well encounter steeper gradients & more difficult terrain. Strenuous — A full day's walk at a brisk pace, probably encountering steep slopes and difficult terrain. May also include yomping and/or short scrambles. There could be time constraints. The pace of the walk is appropriate to the distance and the available time. We ask that walkers accept the pace set. Anyone getting ahead of the leader may be deemed to have left the walk. Good footwear & adequate clothing (including waterproofs) are essential. Please carry enough food & drink for the day. The walk leader reserves the right to refuse participation to anyone who is judged to be not fit or adequately clothed or equipped for the walk concerned, and to vary the walk if conditions so dictate. Under 18 year olds to be accompanied by a responsible adult. Only well behaved dogs on leads please; if NO DOGS stated, only approved assistance dogs allowed.
