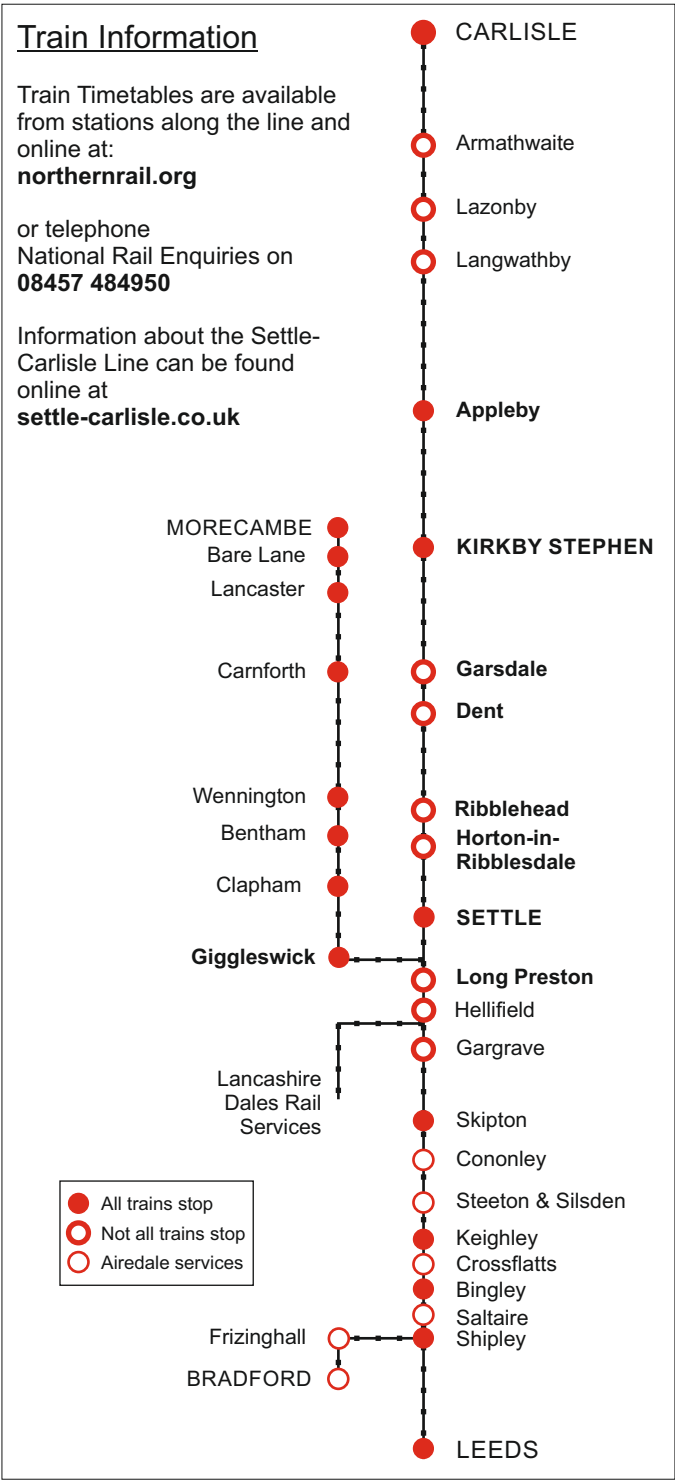
WALKS

Every day of the festival there are a
number of walks on offer, all leaving from
stations along the line. The walks are
organised by different groups, each one
led by an experienced walk leader.
26 are led walks from 4 to 17 miles and 4
are short guided tours. They all start
directly from the station, where you will be
met from the train by your walk leader.
Some walks include a bus ride (*b).
In each case you should arrive properly
prepared with good walking boots and
clothes (including waterproofs) and
enough food and drink for a full day.
All walks are free and don't require booking
in advance. Meet at the station start.


There are easy guided walks to enjoy.
Join Mark & Pat Rand at the Festival
launch for a gentle tour of the beautifully
restored Settle Water Tower.

The walks are graded according to the effort
required and the difficulty of the terrain.
EASY - Leisurely walks with regular stops
for viewing & refreshment. Any climbs will
be of a fairly modest gradient & length.
MODERATE - These cater for the more
experienced walkers. Expect a full day at a
steady pace. You may well encounter
steeper gradients & more difficult terrain.
STRENUOUS - A full day's walk at a brisk
pace; you probably will encounter steep
slopes and difficult terrain. The walk may
also include yomping and/or short
scrambles. There could be time constraints.

Walks. All walks start and finish at a station. Start times correspond with the arrival of a train from Leeds or Carlisle and may be subject to delay. The walk leader will meet you at the station. Walks marked (*b) include a bus ride (fare payable). Finish times are approx. Walkers are responsible for their own travel arrangements to and from the start and finish of each walk. All walks are free and do not require booking.

WALK GRADES: **Easy** – Leisurely walks with regular stops. Any climbs will be of modest gradient & length. **Moderate** – Cater for the more experienced walkers. Expect a full day at a steady pace. May well encounter steeper gradients & more difficult terrain. **Strenuous** – A full day's walk at a brisk pace, probably encountering steep slopes and difficult terrain. May also include yomping and/or short scrambles. There could be time constraints.

The pace of the walk is appropriate to the distance and the available time. We ask that walkers accept the pace set. Anyone getting ahead of the leader may be deemed to have left the walk. Good footwear & adequate clothing (including waterproofs) are essential. Please carry enough food & drink for the day. The walk leader reserves the right to refuse participation to anyone who is judged to be not fit or adequately clothed or equipped for the walk concerned, and to vary the walk if conditions so dictate. Under 18 year olds to be accompanied by a responsible adult. Only well behaved dogs on leads please; if *NO DOGS* stated, only approved assistance dogs allowed.
